

Session 1

Group discussion questions:

1. Read the following passages.

[Genesis 12:1-4] And the Lord said to Abram, Leave your native country, your relatives, and your father's family, and go to the land that I will show you. I will make you into a great nation. I will bless you and make you famous, and you will be a blessing to others. I will bless those who bless you and curse those who treat you with contempt. All the families on earth will be blessed through you. So Abram departed as the Lord had instructed, and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he left Haran.

[Hebrews 11:8-10] It was by faith that Abraham obeyed when God called him to leave home and go to another land that God would give him as an inheritance.

[Genesis 22:2] Take your son, your only son-yes, Isaac, whom you love so much-and go to the land of Morah. Go and sacrifice him as a burnt offering on one of the mountains, which I will show you.

Split into smaller groups and assign each group one of these questions from one of the scriptures above.

Ask the groups to be ready to share what they learn.

1. What do we learn about God?
2. What can we learn about people?
3. What do we learn about the relationship between God and people's relationship with people?
4. Ask each group to briefly share their thoughts with the larger group.

2. Based on these scriptures, what factors do you think enabled Abram to take the first step of obedience?

3. In a journey of faith, Pastor Ed says that the journey is not only about the destination, but also very much about what God will do in us along the way. What mindsets hold followers of Jesus like us back from preparing and stepping out in faith?

4. This journey of faith will challenge any worldly mindsets in us. The True Riches book notes that many regular church attenders who are regular givers, even people who tithe, still prioritize their own sense of financial success and security over a life of faith, obedience and trust in the Lord. In what ways will this journey challenge these in us?

5. Pastor Ed sees:

Room to equip adults for ministry through conferences, leadership training and more LifeGroups
